- Voir Dire
- Opening
- Cross Exam
- Direct Exam
- Closing

Voir Dire: Where You Win!

- "Show them yours!"
- Lost in a desert? Who would you follow out?
- Always refer to each juror by name, not number.
- Citizen's lawyer, not there in defiance of DWI laws.
- Drinking patterns
 - Regularly, Occasionally, Rarely, Never, Not Any More
- Ask open ended questions and loop down the row.
- Never ask a question, you won't also answer.
- ***Acknowledge and deal with your difficult facts. ***
- BT- Thermometer/ Taxalyzer 5000EN
- BEYOND A REASONABLE DOUBT.
- Presumption of Innocence.
- 5th Amendment.
- Rehabilitate.
- Last Criminal Jury trial? (35 years ago)
- Know how to preserve the record.

Opening

- "The evidence will show"
- Start with the theme sentence or trilogy.
- All of your clients great qualities.
- The rest of the story.
- What the government didn't tell you....
- NO WAY BRD!
- Be flexible and able to relate to government's opening, if it helps.
- Exception: Save your cross for case in chief

Cross Exam

- Outline
 - Background, Driving, Contact, SFSTs, Arrest, Transport, Station, DIC-24, BT, BTO
- Never ask a question you don't know the answer to, unless you feel lucky.
- Always lead.
- Establish authority for learned treatises early.
- Control and listen to the witness.
- Look at the jury when you ask the question.
- Make the courtroom yours by walking around.
- Break down the science for a 5 year old / K.I.S.S.
 - body temperature, focal points, SFSTs, breath length, warranty, Z 80 chip
- Demonstrative aids.
- Constantly develop and enhance your theme.
- Don't ask that last question.
- Let the Jury label him/her a liar.

Direct Exam

- Discuss testimony and technique prior to.
- Walk them through the story.
- Talk to the jury.
- Nervousness excuses mistakes.
- Keep your expert simple.
- "I don't remember"
- Popularity contest.
- Only if they need to explain something.

Closing

- Start with your theme.
- Story time.
